

- so that they may be able to work with them to develop a plan that suites both parties;
- the OGC has inspectors to ensure industry is meeting the regulatory requirements;
- the OGC has enforcement officers that provide a lead role concerning any investigations;
- a project lifecycle includes the following: consultation by industry, industries application to the OGC, First Nation consultation, OGC application review and assessment, decision made by OGC with terms and conditions of the approval, industry activity begins, OGC compliance and inspections, OGC enforcement (if needed), industry completes site reclamation and restoration, and OGC reviews and signs off that the reclamation has been completed; and
- discussed legislative changes.

Council had questions on the following issues:

- does the Peace River Regional District have the authority to make decisions about ALR land that is within the Hudson's Hope municipal boundaries;
- questioned how the royalties amounts in British Columbia compare to those in Alberta;
- what health effect criteria is used in determining an ERP for a specific well;
- how much H2S dispersion is allowed/required, per well, in establishing an ERP; and
- what regulations or legislation deals with specific interest of local governments.
